Matthew 28:17 - 'all authority in heaven and on earth has been given [by God] to him'.

Philippians 2:9-11 - God exalted Jesus and gave him the name before all names, that everyone in heaven and on earth would confess Jesus Christ is Lord.

Matthew 16:13-20

'Who do people say that I am?'

'Who do *you* say that I am?'

'You are the Christ, the Son of the living God'

Matthew 16:21

Q 5: Why, if Jesus was Lord of All, did he suffer and die like he did?

God sent his Lord to save those who thought they were Lord.

Acts 2:36 - 'God declared Jesus 'both Lord and Christ'

Acts 10:36 - God gave 'the good news of peace through Jesus Christ, who is Lord of all'
