Congratulations on your Engagement.

As your two lives are coming together it's a major time of change. Now you're trying to catch up with 2 lots of families & friends, dealing with different family expectations & planning for the wedding. It can take its toll & what can easily be squeezed out is your slush time together (e.g. developing your prayer & Bible reading time together & celebrating your developing relationship). So prize & protect your time together. Be careful not to spend too much energy on the wedding day - it's 'only' a church service. It's easy to go way overboard with the wedding, both financially & in preparation — so keep remembering that it's your marriage which is important - you are making life long promises to each other.

Now you're engaged there are some new things you need to get done. Hopefully the following list may assist.

	Make sure both sets of Parents have met each other (that may have long happened).
	Pick a wedding date (it depends on your holidays, money, family, minister, church and reception availability) and time (a Christian wedding generally takes around an hour).
	Book the Minister & Church building (check flower arrangements, sound system & cost)
	lacktriangle Arrange dates to do Marriage Preparation with the Minister (usually takes 4-6 weeks)
	Fill in the 'Notice of Intended Marriage' government form (the Minister will give you one; he'll need to see your birth certificate or passport at least 1 month before wedding; and return form to him)
	☐ Agree on Preacher for Wedding Service
	Book a Reception Venue (timing should be at least an hour and a half after the conclusion of the Wedding Service (excluding travel time).

Marriage Preparation involves four elements. 1. Understanding God's purpose for Marriage. 2. What you do individually and as a couple to prepare yourselves for marriage. 3. Relationship Preparation. 4. Organising the Wedding Service.
