

THE GOSPEL ACCORDING TO JOHN Term 3 2023

Course Introduction

Welcome to term 3 of 2023 TrainingWORKS - School of Ministry!

This course (a PTC level 2/3 elective unit) focuses solely on **John's Gospel**, examining its distinctive content and style. Through a close reading of the text, the distinctive features of John that are drawn out include the concepts of 'life' and 'discipleship'. Specifically, what does it mean to 'live' or 'abide' in Jesus, and what does being a disciple of Jesus actually require?

- The aim of this course is that through the study of John's Gospel we might receive a renewed understanding of our faith and strengthen and encourage us in our Christ-centred lives.
- A second aim for us will be to deepen our theological understanding of the eternal identity of Jesus.
- A final aim of this course is for us to enjoy fellowship with one another as we study and talk about these things together.
