Intentionality

2 Tim 3:¹⁰ You [Timothy], however, know all about my teaching, my [Paul] way of life, my purpose, faith, patience, love, endurance, ¹¹ persecutions, sufferings—what kinds of things happened to me in Antioch, Iconium and Lystra, the persecutions I endured. Yet the Lord rescued me from all of them. ¹² In fact, everyone who wants to live a godly life in Christ Jesus will be persecuted, ¹³ while evildoers and impostors will go from bad to worse, deceiving and being deceived. ¹⁴ But as for you, continue in what you have learned and have become convinced of, because you know those from whom you learned it, ¹⁵ and how from infancy you have known the Holy Scriptures, which are able to make you wise for salvation through faith in Christ Jesus. ¹⁶ All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness, ¹⁷ so that the servant of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work.


4 In the presence of God and of Christ Jesus, who will judge the living and the dead, and in view of his appearing and his kingdom, I give you this charge: ² Preach the word; be prepared in season and out of season; correct, rebuke and encourage—with great patience and careful instruction. ³ For the time will come when people will not put up with sound doctrine. Instead, to suit their own desires, they will gather around them a great number of teachers to say what their itching ears want to hear. ⁴ They will turn their ears away from the truth and turn aside to myths. ⁵ But you, keep your head in all situations, endure hardship, do the work of an evangelist, discharge all the duties of your ministry.

⁶ For I am already being poured out like a drink offering, and the time for my departure is near. ⁷ I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith. ⁸ Now there is in store for me the crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous Judge, will award to me on that day—and not only to me, but also to all who have longed for his appearing. (2 Tim 3:10-4:8)



Consider why we exist as a Church family...

We **gather to proclaim Christ** and do that by *serving* in *Mission* (reaching those we do yet know) and *Ministry* (caring for those we do know) for God's glory.



How we do that will in the first instance *serve Christ's purposes* – that is what he asks of his disciples. Yet in the second instance, and at every point, we *serve Christ's people*.

Leader Training: 4C – Planning Principles for Growth Groups



➤ Think about some of the different ministries of our church. Each of these endeavours are important. At each of our locations — what is an example of a ministry in each category (Seek, Connect, Grow, Send).

Growth Groups – the most key part of our 'Grow' Ministries.

Our Growth Groups exist as a smaller expression of what we do as a whole Church Family - where the <u>Bible</u> is central - and where the group explores, discusses, understands and applies God's Word – in order to <u>prayerfully</u> grow in Christian maturity, service and mission. Our Growth Groups are the best place to offer deep and intentional <u>pastoral care</u>.

- ➤ Think about your Growth Group rate your group (you will not be asked to share your rating). How closely does this definition suit what your groups does?
 - 1 **Absolutely** (this is exactly what we are on about)
 - 2 **Pretty well** (most times we get together the Bible, prayer, pastoral care are our concern)

 - 4 **Not so intentional** (we are a bit hit and miss perhaps more miss!)
 - 5 **Not at all** (we exist for other reasons)

 the Year.



1.	Your – whilst it is true that you are the leader, and hence doing the planning to serve those who are in the group. There is no harm in involving them in the process. Not only does this create ownership, but it helps to ensure that all involved in the group understand what you are on about.					
2.	Your – the best team is one which works and plans together – for you help one another stay on the same page.					
	A trap that co-leaders often fall into is to plan by dividing! 'You do this week and I will do that week' – the result is that you one have one leader at any one time (for the other week they check-out when they are not 'on').					
	That does not mean preparing everything together, but it should mean doing the <i>Strategic Planning</i> together					
	Then doing the <i>Tactical Planning</i> together					
	Which means when you get to each week – your <i>Operational Planning</i> will be much easier. But more importantly

Bible:

- Each week aim to explore, discuss, understand and apply.
- In following the Preaching plan you will find that across the year you will address:
 - A Gospel OT NT Doctrine/Topic Seasonal (evangelistic)
 - you will also find that you are serving your members by helping them to either hear the Bible Talk better (if you are doing studies preceding the Bible Talk) or reinforce what they have heard in the Bible Talk (if you are doing the study afterwards). Both can be helpful.
 - Plan in a mix of pre-prepared studies vs own studies
 - A trap we can fall into is too <u>overestimated</u> the value of topical studies and <u>underestimated</u> the value of exegetical studies.

Yet as some groups often do – they will follow what they want to look at in the Bible (which is fine). It is still helpful to have a good balance of Gospel/OT/NT/Doctrine across the year.

- Intro Bible study for each new series.
- Also notice different Authors/genres Appendix A
- Recognise that different groups will be at different stages
- Consider an External Church Events (i.e. CMS Summer School, Men Meeting the Challenge, Single Minded Conference, Equip Women etc)
- Avoid: reading Christian Books together (better for a book club) or watching Videos should not be the main diet.

Prayer:

- Be intentional in planning what you pray...
- Schedule in LMAP Missionary Partner Prayer Nights and/or Seek and Send
- Have a Prayer coordinator
 - > Comment/suggestion about planning tips to promote an intentional Growth Groups prayer focus?

Pastoral Care

- Pastoral Care is so important in Growth Groups. Paul reminds the church in Thessalonica about the important of 'sharing not only the gospel of God but our lives as well' (1 Thess 2:8). Key here is that their lives (joys and burdens) are shared because the gospel is proclaimed among them.
- In our Pastoral Care, we must make sure that we are helping people spiritually as well as physically and emotionally.
- Caution is there is always more Pastoral Care that can be given. Remember we are helping our group cast our burdens on Jesus, not on one another!
- Consider planning into your Growth Group program
 - Internal Church Events
 - Plan a Weekend Away (but don't take people away from church)
 - Find a Mission activity that you can do together
 - A way to serve you wider church family as a group (e.g. Welcoming, Morning Tea/Dinner).
 - Build in Flexi nights

Appendix 1 – The Bible Genres					
	Section	Books of the Bible	Information about the 'section'		
	The Law (The Pentateuch)	Genesis Exodus Leviticus Numbers Deuteronomy	God gave foundational teaching which sets the context for the rest of the Bible – creation, sin, promise, exodus, salvation, law. God's people called to live under his rule and moving towards a new land.		
	The Former Prophets	Joshua Judges 1 & 2 Samuel 1 & 2 Kings	These 'Former' Prophets detail the period when Israel heard God's word by appointed judges and then kings. The Former Prophets describes God's history with Israel as they move into the promised land and ultimately fail to live under God's rule. The result is division as the <i>Northern Kingdom</i> (Israel) is overthrown by the Assyrians (in 722 _{BC}) and the <i>Southern Kingdom</i> (Judah) by the Babylonians (in 597 _{BC}). God's people scattered and removed from God's land as a consequence of not living under his rule.		
OLD TESTAMENT – the Old Covenant	The Latter Prophets	Isaiah Jeremiah Ezekiel Hosea Joel Amos Obadiah Jonah Micah Nahum	Prophets speak the words of God for the benefit of God's people (Israel). The 'Latter' Prophets deal with the period of Israel's history immediately before, during or after the conquests of the Northern and Southern Kingdoms. The prophets make clear that God's gracious purposes have not failed or been abandoned and that he remains faithful to his people despite their unfaithfulness. God's people are in exile from God's land but still called to acknowledge God's rule. Isaiah, Jeremiah and Ezekiel are often called the 'Major Prophets'.		
OLD TESTAMEN	Wisdom	Habakkuk Zephaniah Haggai Zechariah Malachi Job Proverbs Song of Solomon (Songs) Ecclesiastes	Wisdom Literature deals with problems of universal and ageless significance. They focus on a wide variety of issues including suffering, death, friendship, love, marriage, loyalty and wisdom. Of all the sections of the Old Testament – this part is least tied to the specific culture or history of Israel.		
	Psalms	Psalms	The Psalms contain a whole range of responses to God in prayer and praise, poetry and song, dating from many different periods of the history of Israel.		
	The Writings	Ruth Lamentations Esther Daniel Ezra Nehemiah 1 & 2 Chronicles	The Writings are a selection of texts which cover the period of the Southern Kingdom exile and beyond. For example, 1 & 2 Chronicles retrace the history of Israel from King David to the fulfillment of the promise that the Lord will restore Israel. Daniel, using apocalyptic imagery, reveals God's plans for Israel after the exile. Ezra and Nehemiah portray something of the situation of a relatively small number of Israelites who were restored to the land and sought to rebuild Jerusalem.		
NEW TESTAMENT - the New Covenant	The Gospels	Matthew Mark Luke John	The Gospels show us Jesus – the one who is Son of David, Son of God, Saviour and Lord of Israel and all the nations. The Gospels detail Jesus' life, death and resurrection and show how Jesus fulfills the Old Testament in every way. In Jesus, God's people are saved into an eternal land and live under God's gracious rule.

Acts of the Apostles The Letters (the Epistles) Revelation	Romans 1 & 2 Corinthians Galatians Ephesians Philippians Colossians 1 & 2 Thessalonians 1 & 2 Timothy Titus Philemon Hebrews James 1 & 2 Peter 1, 2 & 3 John Jude Revelation	Acts is a companion volume to Luke's Gospel and shows how the message of Christ was preached and taught beyond the borders of Israel to all the other nations. Acts forms a helpful bridge to the letters which follow - it shows how Christianity spread and what it meant for all people to be followers of Jesus. The letters explain the significance of Jesus' life, death, resurrection and ascension for all people – especially those who believe. They show how the promises of the Old Testament have been or are being fulfilled in Jesus – but point to more still to come when Jesus returns. The letters deal theologically and practically with problems faced by the early churches. Of the letters, thirteen are written by the Apostle Paul. The Revelation of John brings the New Testament (and the whole Bible) to a close with a focus on the glorified Jesus. Using visions and apocalyptic imagery, it reveals the implications of Jesus death, resurrection and ascension and points to the day of Jesus' final return. God's people will live in God's eternal place and enjoy his eternal and perfect rule.
