# GENERAL OVERVIEW

# The Thessalonian Church

1 Thessalonians

Read Acts 17:1–15; 18:1–5

- What characterises the Thessalonians who became Christians? (cf 1 Thess 1:3, 6–10)
- What characterises those opposed to the gospel mission of Paul?

(cf 1 Thess 1:6; 2:2, 14–16)

- What characterises those who brought the gospel to Thessalonica?

(cf 1 Thess 1:2, 5–6; 2:2–12, 17–20; 3:1–2)

# The Thessalonian Epistles

1&2 Thessalonians

- What has Paul been doing during his separation from the Thessalonians? (cf Acts 18:1–5)

We know much about Paul's missionary method from 1 Thessalonians. His first point of contact is to address the Jews in the synagogue, if there is one, then to speak publicly about God to the Gentiles.

- What concerns about the Thessalonians were on his mind?

(cf 1 Thess 2:19–20; 3:2–5, 10–11; 2 Thess 1:5–11; 2:1–3; 3:6–15)

- Why was it necessary for Paul to write a second letter so soon after the first?

# Themes in the Epistles

1&2 Thessalonians

Motives and Methods of the mission.

(1 Thess 1:6-8; 2:1-12; 3:1; 5:11-12, 14f, 23f; 2 Thess 1:11f; 2:16f; 3:1f)

Content of the teaching

(1 Thess 1:5, 6, 8; 2:2, 4-5, 8, 9, 13; 3:2; 4:1-14; 5:1f, 9-10; 2 Thess 1:8, 2:14-15; 3:1, 6-10)

Return of Christ

(1 Thess 4:13f; Matt 24:30f; Jn 6:39f; 1 Cor 15:51f; 1 Thess 5:1-11; Matt 24:36-44; Lk 12:39f; 21:34f; 2 Thess 1:5-12; 2:1-12; Matt 24:10-31; 2 Thess 2:13-15)
